

## **Bianca Montrosse-Moorhead**

Bianca Montrosse-Moorhead, PhD, (United States of America) is an associate professor of research methods, measurement, and evaluation in the University of Connecticut's (UConn) Neag School of Education, and program coordinator for UConn's Graduate Certificate in Program Evaluation.

As an evaluation researcher, educator, and practitioner, Dr. Montrosse-Moorhead specializes in evaluation theory, methodology, practice, and capacity building. For example, she has published on important issues such as the



identification of what evaluators need to know and be able to do, gaps between evaluator education and the demands of on-the-ground practice, the soundness of evaluative arguments, and the importance of establishing professional standards for public evaluation work. Her scholarship has appeared in the *American Journal of Evaluation*, *New Directions for Evaluation*, the *Journal of Multidisciplinary Evaluation*, and *Evaluation and Program Planning*.

She also has an active evaluation practice, and has directed several evaluations at the local, state, and national level. In 2014, Dr.

Montrosse-Moorhead was the recipient of the American Evaluation Association's Marcia Guttentag Award, the association's only early career award. In 2017, she was appointed to the editorial board of *New Directions for Evaluation*, an official journal of the American Evaluation Association (AEA), and elected to a three-year term on the AEA Board. She is an active member of the American Evaluation Association (AEA), the European Evaluation Society (EES), and EvalPartners. Dr. Montrosse-Moorhead currently co-chairs EvalYouth, an international network that aims to build novice evaluator capacity throughout the world.
