Twenty-eight years of experience as senior consultant, researcher and evaluator in the social development sector, linked to international cooperation, governmental and civil society organisations. Recognised for her specialised though systemic and creative approaches to key poverty, development and exclusion topics, like gender, violence, rights, sexual and reproductive health, aging and adolescents. Advocate and facilitator of transformative planning, management and evaluation approaches (e.g. Theories of Change). Has led and participated in complex



international evaluations. Particularly interested in power issues, ethics, gender and intercultural relations, as well as a competencies approach to integrally define a good evaluator in the context of the Sustainable Development Goals and the “to leave no one behind” mandate.

Internationally known as a speaker and human rights activist. Between 2016 and June 2018, president of the Bolivian Monitoring and Evaluation Network (REDMEBOL), recognized for her work in strengthening and repositioning the volunteer organization for professional evaluation (VOPE) nationally and internationally. Decalogue of Evaluation from a Gender Perspective and promotor of the South to South Evaluation Initiative. In December 2017 elected General Coordinator of the Latin American and Caribbean Monitoring, Evaluation and Systematization Network (ReLAC).
